On April 19, 2008, college students and members of McLean County will be coming together under a vision of commonality. We believe that despite the diversity that comes with age, gender, race, and socioeconomic status, there is an inherent commonality that we all share as human beings. Intersection '08 is an event that embraces that thought, consisting of a day of service throughout the community as well as a celebration gathering at Capen Auditorium on the campus of Illinois State University. During the day, participants in the event will be meeting at several different places throughout Bloomington-Normal, including the Jesus house located in West Bloomington, Bloomington Day Care and Kid's Club East (a subsidized day-care for low income families) in Bloomington, and the old Washington High School to honor the elderly with a free dance. The idea is that people from all different walks of life will be intersecting under one goal, whether that would be serving a meal, giving away new clothes, improving a day-care, or honoring our elders.
